If inhaled

Excerpt from ERG Guide 154 [Substances - Toxic and/or Corrosive (Non-Combustible)]: TOXIC; inhalation, ingestion or skin contact with material may cause severe injury or death. Indication of immediate medical attention and special treatment needed, if necessary

Basic treatment: Establish a patent airway (oropharyngeal or nasopharyngeal airway, if needed). Suction if necessary. Watch for signs of respiratory insufficiency and assist ventilations if necessary. Administer oxygen by nonrebreather mask at 10 to 15 L/min. Monitor for pulmonary edema and treat if necessary . Monitor for shock and treat if necessary . Anticipate seizures and treat if necessary . For eye contamination, flush eyes immediately with water. Irrigate each eye continuously with 0.9% saline (NS) during transport . Do not use emetics. For ingestion, rinse mouth and administer 5 ml/kg up to 200 ml of water for dilution if the patient can swallow, has a strong gag reflex, and does not drool. Administer activated charcoal . Aromatic hydrocarbons and related compounds

Toxicity to fish: LC50 - Poecilia reticulata - 6.6 mg/L - 14 d.

Persistence and degradability

AEROBIC: Less than 0.1% of applied 2,4-dichloronitrobenzene was degraded in a 5 day biodegradation study using activated sludge from a municipal sewage treatment plant(1). However, since bacteria capable of degrading unspecified chloronitrobenzene isomers have been isolated, these compounds are not expected to be inherently recalcitrant(2).

Bioaccumulative potential

A BCF value of 84 was measured in guppies (Poecilia reticulata) during 3-day exposure to 2,4-dichloronitrobenzene(1). A 3-day exposure BCF of 80 was determined for golden ide fish (Leuciscus idus melanotus)(2). Rainbow trout, under continuous flow conditions and a water concentration of 750 ng/L, had a BCF value of 120 after 36 days exposure(3). According to a classification

scheme(4), BCF values of 30 to 100 are moderate and 100 to 1000 are high. A 1-day exposure BCF of 150 was reported for green algae (Chlorella fusca)(2).

Mobility in soil

The Koc of 2,4-dichloronitrobenzene is estimated as 1,100(SRC), using a log Kow of 3.07(1) and a regression-derived equation(2). According to a classification scheme(3), this estimated Koc value suggests that 2,4-dichloronitrobenzene is expected to have low mobility in soil.

Disposal methods

Product

The material can be disposed of by removal to a licensed chemical destruction plant or by controlled incineration with flue gas scrubbing. Do not contaminate water, foodstuffs, feed or seed by storage or disposal. Do not discharge to sewer systems.

Contaminated packaging

Containers can be triply rinsed (or equivalent) and offered for recycling or reconditioning. Alternatively, the packaging can be punctured to make it unusable for other purposes and then be disposed of in a sanitary landfill. Controlled incineration with flue gas scrubbing is possible for combustible packaging materials.
