## Description of necessary first-aid measures

#### If inhaled

Move the victim into fresh air. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen. If not breathing, give artificial respiration and consult a doctor immediately. Do not use mouth to mouth resuscitation if the victim ingested or inhaled the chemical.

## Possibility of hazardous reactions

N,N'-DIETHYLTHIOUREA is an amide. Amides/imides react with azo and diazo compounds to generate toxic gases. Flammable gases are formed by the reaction of organic amides/imides with strong reducing agents. Amides are very weak bases (weaker than water). Imides are less basic yet and in fact react with strong bases to form salts. That is, they can react as acids. Mixing amides with dehydrating agents such as P2O5 or SOCI2 generates the corresponding nitrile. The combustion of these compounds generates mixed oxides of nitrogen (NOx).

experimental animals for the carcinogenicity of N,N'-diethylthiourea. Overall evaluation: N,N-diethylthiourea os not classifiable as to its carcinogenicity to humans (Group 3).

### Bioaccumulative potential

Based on a log Kow value of 0.57(1), the BCF for N,N-diethylthiourea can be estimated to be 2 from a regression-derived equation(2). Thus bioconcentration should not be important in aquatic organisms(SRC).

### Mobility in soil

Based upon an experimental value of 0.57 for log Kow(1), the Koc for N,N-diethylthiourea can be estimated to be 49 from a linear regression-derived equation(2,SRC). This estimated Koc suggests that N,N-diethylthiourea will be highly mobile in soil(3,SRC).

#### **Product**

The material can be disposed of by removal to a licensed chemical destruction plant or by controlled incineration with flue gas scrubbing. Do not contaminate water, foodstuffs, feed or seed by storage or disposal. Do not discharge to sewer systems.

### Contaminated packaging

Containers can be triply rinsed (or equivalent) and offered for recycling or reconditioning. Alternatively, the packaging can be punctured to make it unusable for other purposes and then be disposed of in a sanitary landfill. Controlled incineration with flue gas scrubbing is possible for combustible packaging materials.
