Description of necessary first-aid measures

If inhaled

Persistence and degradability

AEROBIC: Hydrocodone was apparently formed from dihydrocodeine, following addition of the latter at a concn of 10 ug/L to an activated sludge inoculum (diluted 1:5, 0.8 g/L dry solids) incubated under batch reactor conditions(1). Following a 3-day lag, the concentration of hydrocodone after 70 hours rose to 0.7 ug/L(1).

Bioaccumulative potential

An estimated BCF of 12 was calculated in fish for hydrocodone(SRC), using an estimated log Kow of 2.16(1) and a regressionderived equation(1). According to a classification scheme(2), this BCF suggests the potential for bioconcentration in aquatic organisms is low(SRC).

Mobility in soil

Using a structure estimation method based on molecular connectivity indices(1), the Koc of hydrocodone can be estimated to be

1,100(SRC). According to a classification scheme(2), this estimated Koc value suggests that hydrocodone is expected to have low mobility in soil. The pKa of hydrocodone is 8.23(3), indicating that this compound will exist partially in the cation form in the environment and cations generally adsorb more strongly to soils containing organic carbon and clay than their neutral counterparts(4). Hydrocodone was 28.0% and 76.7% absorbed to a carbonaceous resin and a coconut shell-based absorbant, respectively, in a drinking water treatment study using Lake Mead water, Nevada(5). Hydrocodone concentrations were shown to decrease with increasing salinity in a test conducted in an estuary in Jamaica Bay, Long Island, NY(6).

Disposal methods

Product

The material can be disposed of by removal to a licensed chemical destruction plant or by controlled incineration with flue gas scrubbing. Do not contaminate water, foodstuffs, feed or seed by storage or disposal. Do not discharge to sewer systems.

Contaminated packaging

Containers can be triply rinsed (or equivalent) and offered for recycling or reconditioning. Alternatively, the packaging can be punctured to make it unusable for other purposes and then be disposed of in a sanitary landfill. Controlled incineration with flue gas scrubbing is possible for combustible packaging materials.
