Description of necessary first-aid measures

If inhaled

Move the victim into fresh air. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen. If not breathing, give artificial respiration and consult a doctor immediately. Do not use mouth to mouth resuscitation if the victim ingested or inhaled the chemical.

Following skin contact

Take off contaminated clothing immediately. Wash off with soap and plenty of water. Consult a doctor.

Rinse with pure water for at least 15 minutes. Consult a doctor.

Persistence and degradability

AEROBIC: H3-Labeled nortriptyline, present at 10 ug/g, exhibited half-life of 40.5 days using a loam soil from Ontario, Canada incubated at 30 deg C for 78 days. The degradation products identified were 10-OH-nortriptyline and 2-OH-nortriptyline(1).

Bioaccumulative potential

An estimated BCF of 440 was calculated in fish for nortriptyline(SRC), using a log Kow of 4.51(1) and a regression-derived equation(2). According to a classification scheme(2), this BCF suggests the potential for bioconcentration in aquatic organisms is high(SRC).

Mobility in soil

A log Koc of 3.51 (Kd = 117 L/kg), corresponding to a Koc of 3236, was measured using an agricultural soil (pH 6.3) from Corrstown, Co Dublin, Ireland(1). According to a classification scheme(2), this Koc value suggests that nortriptyline is expected to have slight mobility in soil. The estimated pKa of nortriptyline is 10.47(3), indicating that this compound will exist almost entirely in the cation form in the environment and cations generally adsorb more strongly to soils containing organic carbon and clay than their neutral counterparts(4). A Kd values of 600 L/kg hahes been reported using a digester sludge from wastewater treatment plant, Dublin Ireland (pH 6.3)(1).

Disposal methods

Product

The material can be disposed of by removal to a licensed chemical destruction plant or by controlled incineration with flue gas scrubbing. Do not contaminate water, foodstuffs, feed or seed by storage or disposal. Do not discharge to sewer systems.

Contaminated packaging

Containers can be triply rinsed (or equivalent) and offered for recycling or reconditioning. Alternatively, the packaging can be

punctured to make it unusable for other purposes and then be disposed of in a sanitary landfill. Controlled incineration with flue gas scrubbing is possible for combustible packaging materials.
